












We are honored to welcome Rev. Jihyun Oh as our keynote speaker. With wisdom, insight, and a deep commitment to the church's future, she will help us envision new ways to grow together in faith and community.

The Rev. Jihyun Oh is the Stated Clerk of the General Assembly and Executive

Director of the Interim United Agency of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). She was elected and installed at the 226th General Assembly in July 2024. Oh is only the second woman to serve in the denomination's highest office, and the first woman and the first Korean American elected to lead the PC(USA) in its more than 300-year history in the United States.

As Stated Clerk, Oh not only serves as the ecclesial and ecumenical Head of Communion for the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), but also offers constitutional, spiritual, and strategic leadership for the life and witness of the church. In her role as Executive Director of the Interim Unified Agency, Oh is providing intentional relationship and bridge-building internally with the staff of the newly unified agency and externally with national and global partners as she, and leadership partners, guides the PC(USA) into a new era of its life and work together.

In this workshop, participants will learn about a variety of funding models that help congregations find a path toward financial sustainability. This includes actionable steps, real-life examples, and practical resources to build additional revenue streams and support congregational mission and ministry for the next generation of disciples.

A3 2020 Vision:

Accounts of Congregational Transformation Due to Livestream Technology

Providentially, Martin Luther nailed the 95 Thesis to a church door in Germany in the age of the printing press, and his words were mass produced, spreading across Europe. Just as providentially, the COVID Pandemic hit in the age of the internet, enabling us to worship together virtually, but now what? Should churches drop their on-line services, or might God be doing a new thing?

Rev. Joe Evans, Senior Pastor of First Presbyterian Church, just completed his Doctorate of Ministry project focused on "networked religion."

Rev. Andy James, Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta, has helped lead online worship gatherings since early 2020.

A4 Pop Culture Faith: Teaching the Gospel through TV and Film

Pop culture influences the clothes we wear, the music we listen to, the attitudes we hold, and even the language we use. In fact, the average American spends two hours per day consuming digital media! Yet church educators are often unsure how to leverage television and film in their adult faith formation groups. Through this workshop, we will examine three real-life groups who have successfully used shows like "Ted Lasso" and "The Good Place" as a catalyst for faith formation. Participants will then consider their own context: what shows would speak to their congregation, what setup would be most appropriate, and what buy-in would be needed. Finally, participants will learn how to design and execute an 8-session adult small group study that explores faith through the lens of popular television or film.

A5 What's Your Story?

Grounded in the art of storytelling, this workshop transforms abstract ideas into practical insights, helping participants learn through narrative and reflection.

B8 Making Room at the Table for Older Adult Ministry

About 70% of the total reported membership for the PCUSA in 2024 was above the age of 56. Yet many congregations aren't as aware of the implications of aging for faith and human development, nor do they allocate resources (facilities, funds, staff/volunteer support) for older adult ministry as they do for other age/stage ministries. This workshop will invite participants to consider the faith and human development aspects of aging, assess what their congregations are already doing, and identify where even small changes may extend a wider welcome to older adults in your community.

The Rev. Dr. Sarah Erickson is a clergy affiliate member at North Decatur Presbyterian Church and served as the Director of Lifelong Learning at Columbia Theological seminary, where she helped launch the Older Adult Ministry Certificate Program. She currently serves as partnership coordinator for the Presbyterian Older Adult Ministry Network (www.poamn.org) and as a member of the leadership team for The Association of Leaders of Lifelong Learning for Ministry (www.alllm.org).

From US-17 in Brunswick, take the F.J. Torras Causeway to St. Simons Island. Once you reach St. Simons Island, follow the new round-about left towards Sea Island Road. Go straight through the light. Take first left at Hamilton Road, then right on Arthur J. Moore Drive. Go through the Entrance Gate, and the Front Desk/ Pitts Building will be on your left. Registration will occur near the front desk until 6:30 p.m. Late registration will be available in Brown Auditorium.
